Their dedication to positively impacting the lives of vulnerable youth is truly admirable. Their contributions make a significant difference in the lives of those they support, demonstrating that a simple act of kindness can have a farreaching and positive impact.

Impact Stories

Jane

Jane was dropped off at the footsteps of a CPS office when she was 4 years old. Her parents had relinquished their rights and a family member temporarily stepped up to assist in her care but lacked consistency and eventually, they too, walked away from her leaving her in the custody of the state. CASA Advocate Tracy was assigned to Jane's case, over the next few years she had multiple case workers, changed households 8 times and each time was forced to change schools.

She never knew where she would be placed next or how long she would get to stay in a home. She experienced the trauma of abandonment and uncertainty, time and time again. Tracy was by Jane's side from day one and remained a constant and trusted support.

Because of her consistency, personal relationship and understanding of Jane's needs, she and the CASA team identified a family who could provide the support and stability that Jane required. After advocating for Jane, CPS, empower (the "new privatized version of CPS"), case attorneys and other stakeholders involved in the case all agreed that a move to this home would be in her best interest.

I am happy to report that because of Tracy's hard work, advocating and determination, later this summer, Jane will have a family of her own and will finally be adopted!



Amelia

Amelia (9 months old) was removed from her home due to extreme medical neglect, where she had developed sepsis and multiple other health issues. CASA ensured she had the necessary medical services such as occupational and speech therapy to heal and thrive. Amelia is now living a healthy and happy life, where her medical, social and emotional needs are being met.

Isaac

The transition into foster care was difficult for Isaac (14), and with frequent changes he had experienced numerous failed placements. CASA volunteer, John, proved to be a consistent role model and advocate. He empowered Isaac to learn healthy ways to express himself and was key to Isaac's future success and adoption.

"I give my time and efforts to CASA because they are on the front lines with children and families in need. I know that my efforts are not wasted. CASA changes lives for the better and they are part of the healing process for children who have experienced trauma, abuse, and neglect. Their mission brings joy, love, compassion, and safety to some of the most vulnerable members of society."




